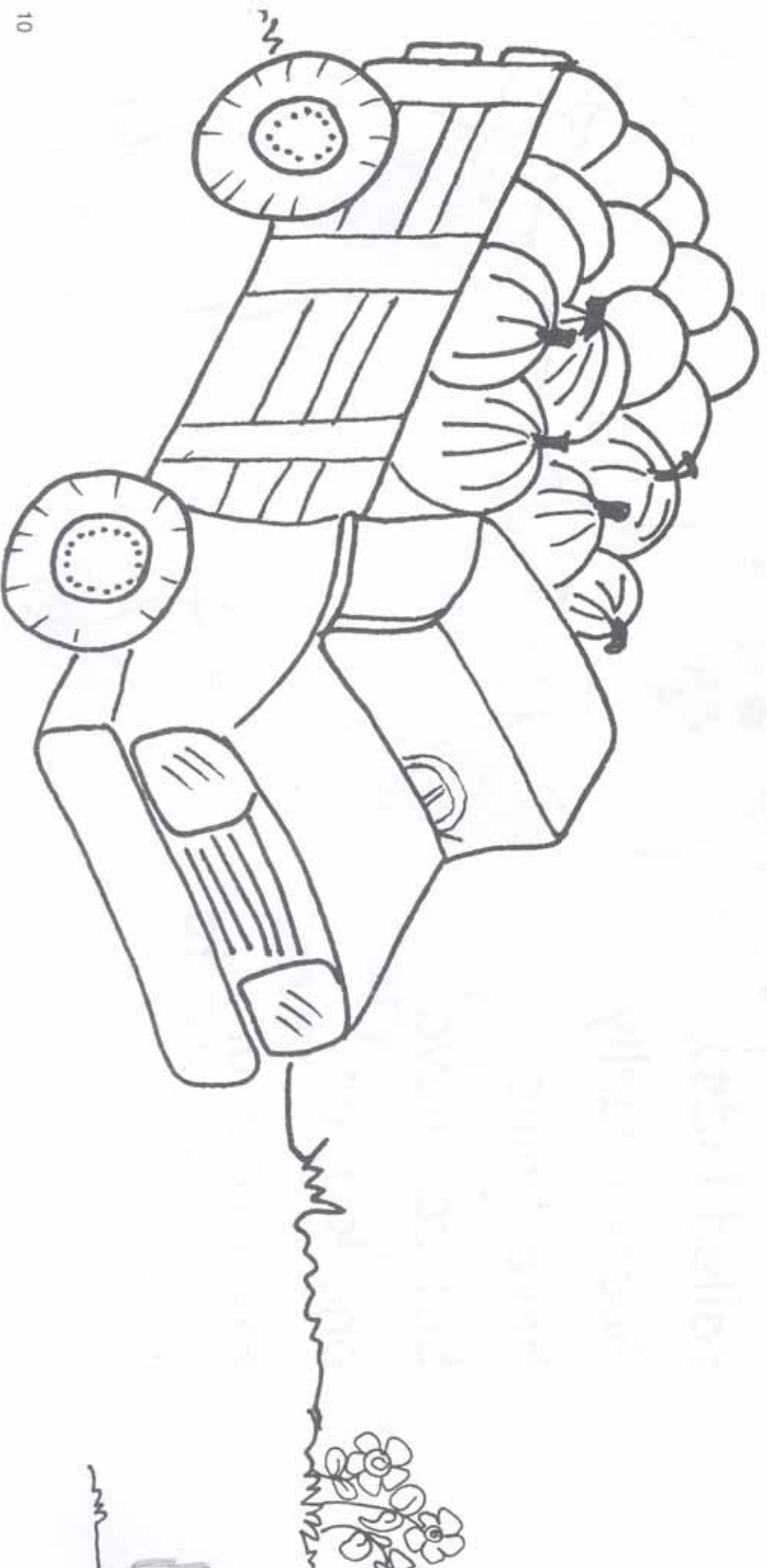
Kentucky is one of the fastest growing states for **goat** production in the U.S.

Goats usually have twins, but can have one kid, or even four or five kids.

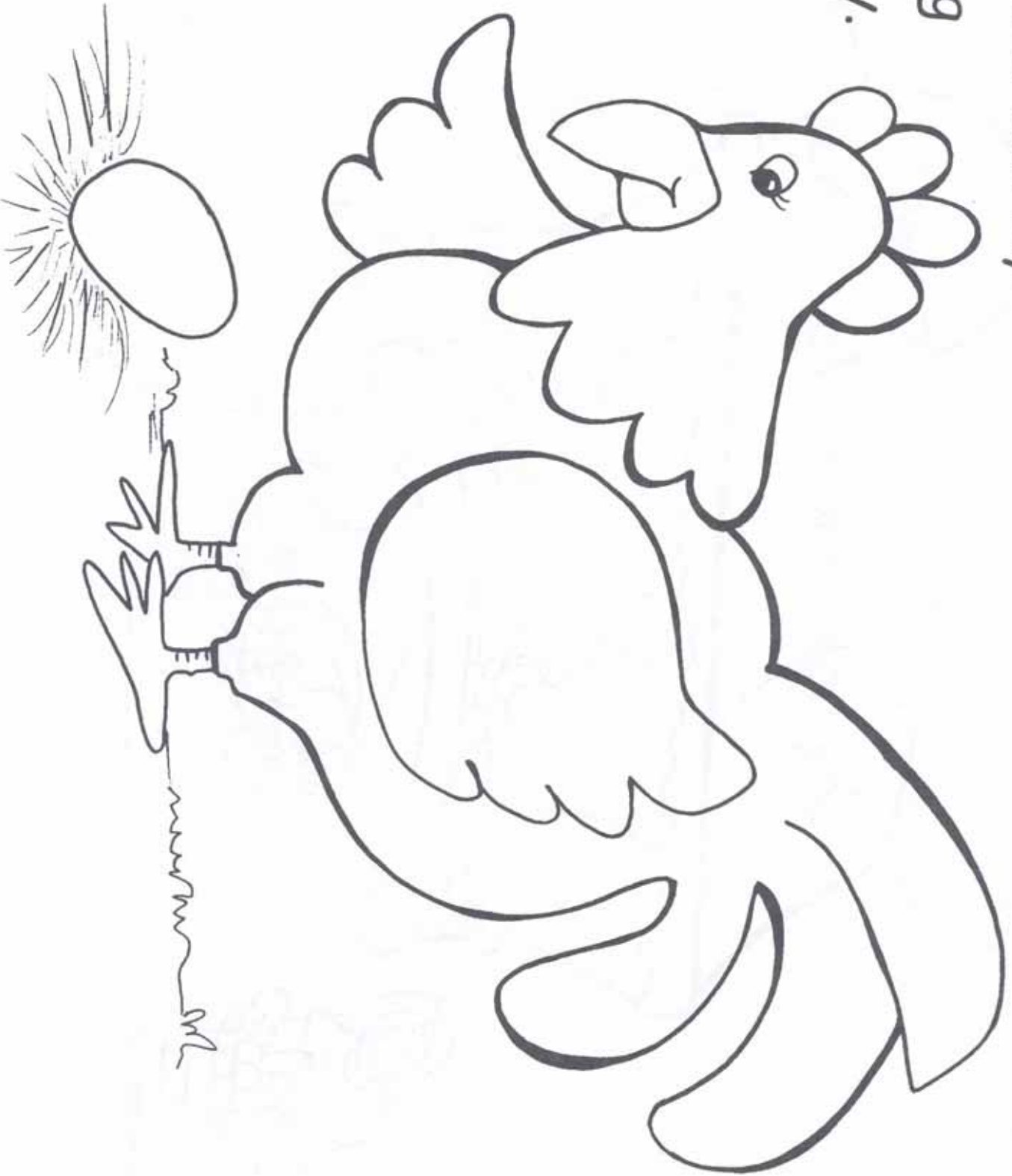

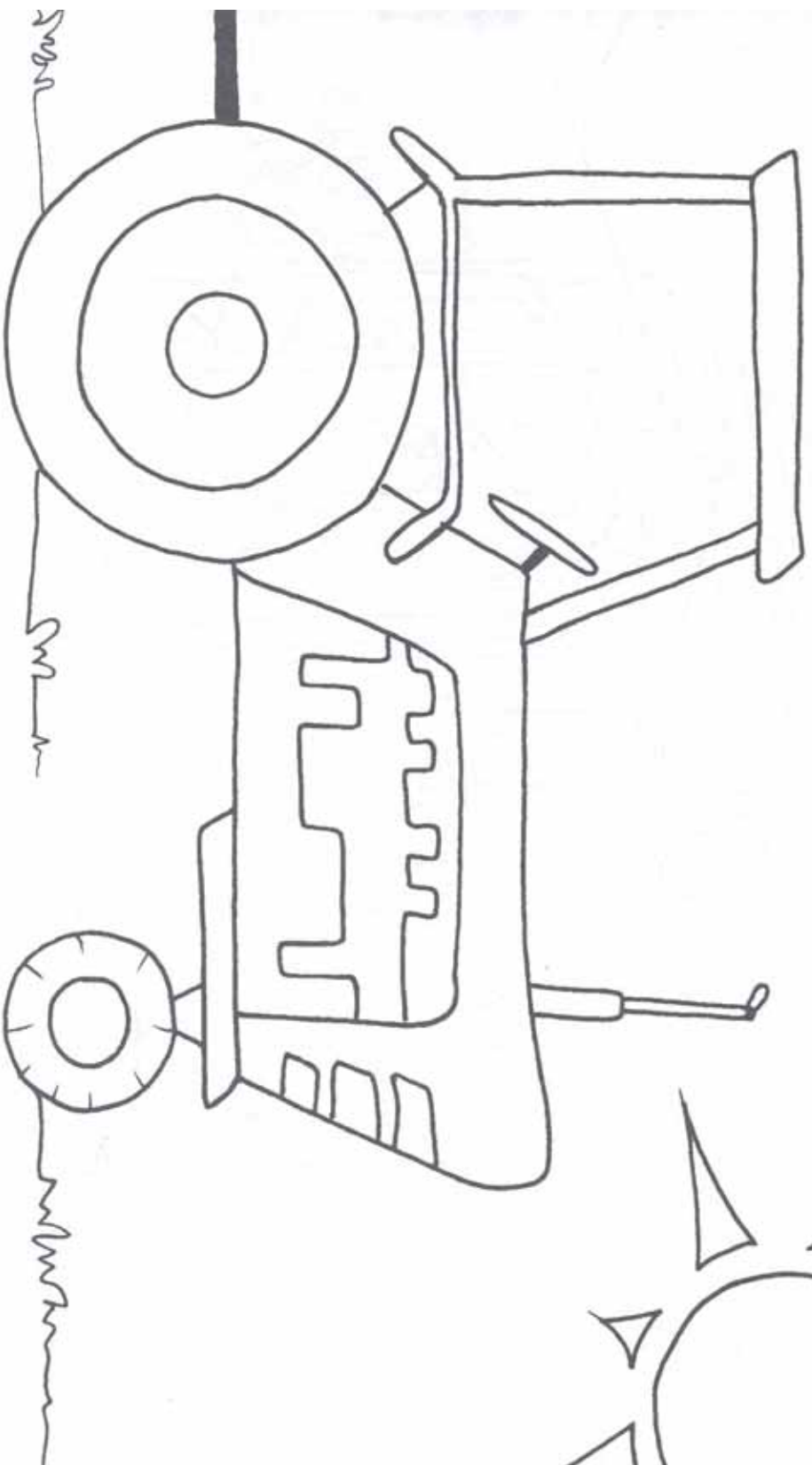
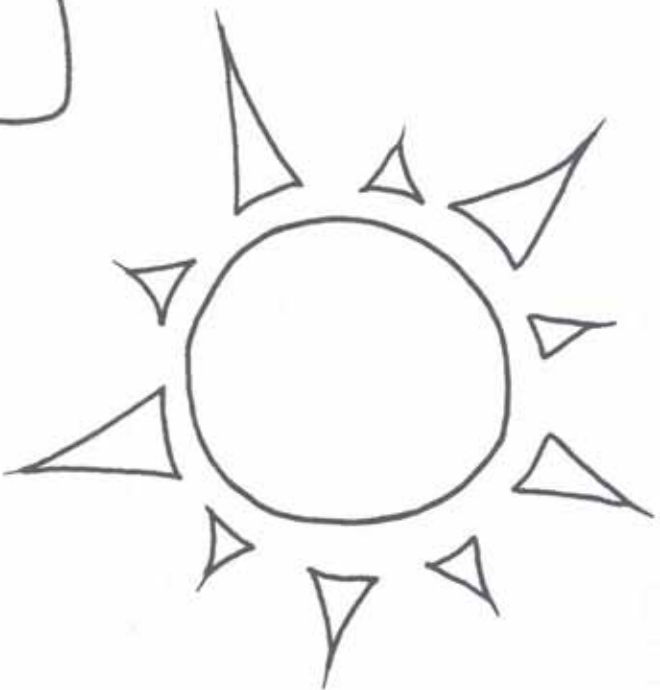
AGRITOURISM

participate in feeding animals and

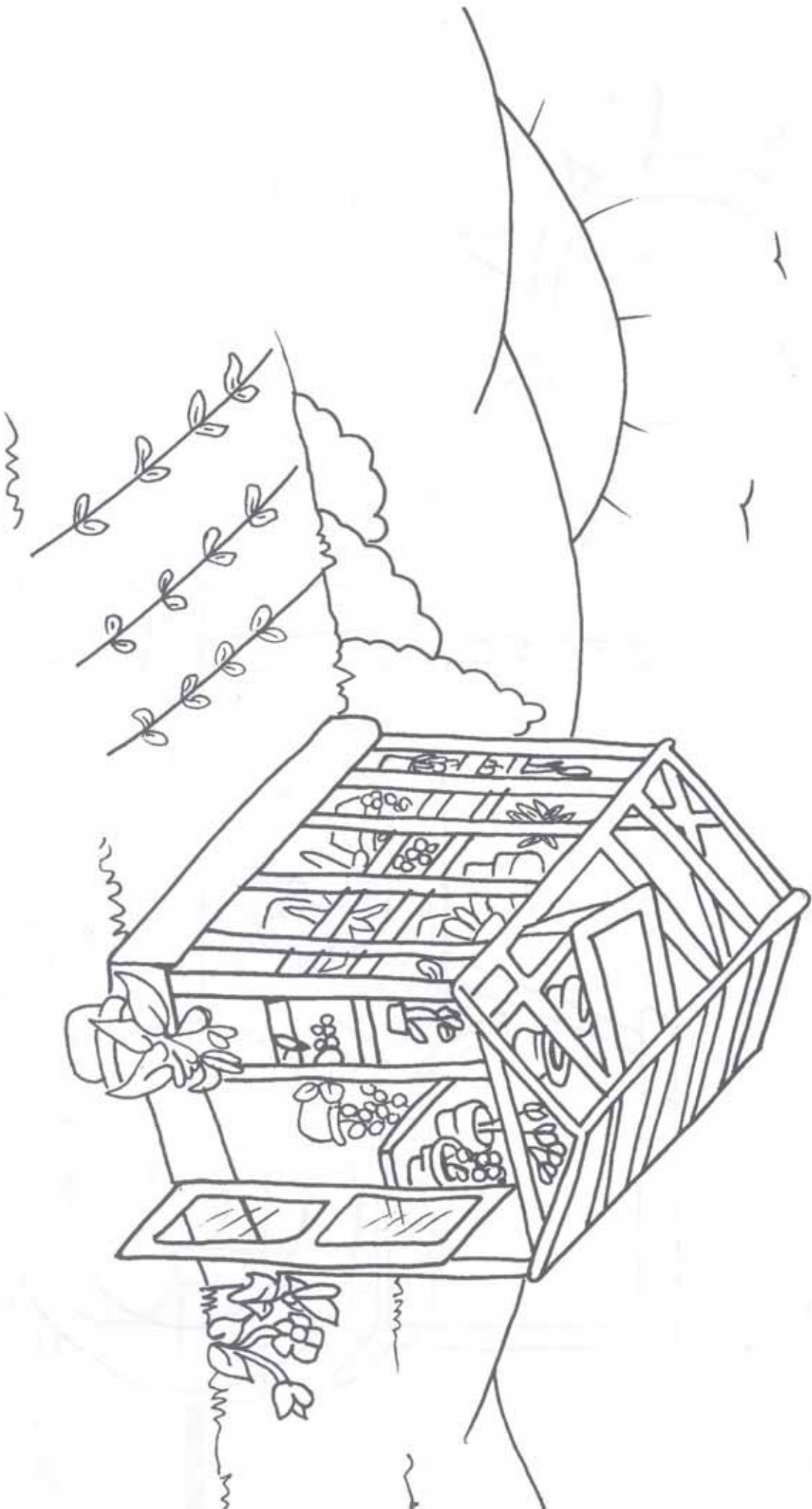


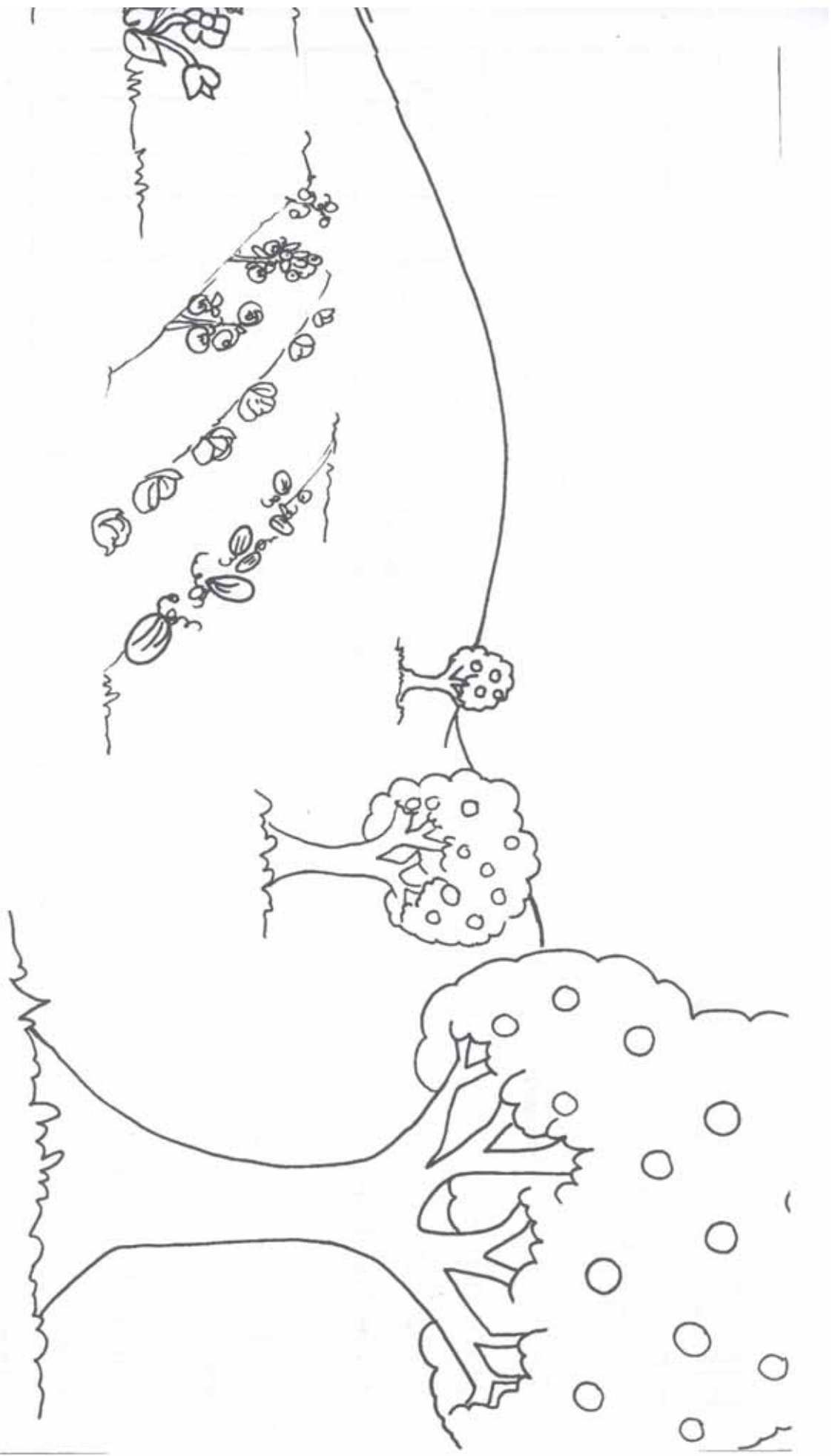
