Kevin R. Jeffries – Oldham County

Kevin Jeffries, of Crestwood Kentucky, was elected to the Oldham County Conservation District Board in 1983. In addition to having served as board chairman, Mr. Jeffries has served as past president of the Oldham County FFA Chapter; has been a KY Farm Bureau State board member since 1989; was KY Farm Bureau State Young Farmer Chairman in 1989; served as past president of the Oldham County Farm Bureau; was past chairman of the Southern States Kentuckiana Service; was appointed by Governor Brereton Jones to serve on the State Ag Water Quality Authority Board - 1994 to present; was president of the Kentucky Association of Conservation Districts from 2005 to 2009; and discussed Biotech Foods as a guest on KET “Kentucky Tonight” in 2001.

Mr. Jeffries currently is active in lobbying, in Frankfort and Washington, for various issues affecting agriculture. Since 1997 he has served as a Commissioner of the Oldham County Planning Commission, taking over the role of chairman in 2007.

He is a member of the Oldham County Growth Management Task Force - 2001 to present and currently serves as chairman.

Kevin serves as board member for the National Association of Conservation Districts (NACD) and was an NACD appointee to the 25x25 Ag Leader Clean Energy Group.

Mr. Jeffries was recently selected as Oldham Countian of the Year 2011 by the Oldham County Chamber!

In his spare time (does he have any??) Kevin is co-owner and operator of Grand Meadows Farms, LLC. He co-owns and operates 275 acres of farmland and, with his brother-in-law, an additional 1225 acres raising corn, soybeans, wheat, hay, beef cattle in Oldham County.

Kevin graduated from Oldham County High School in 1978 and received his Bachelor of Science in Agriculture from the University of Kentucky in 1992.
